2003 Murder of Virginia Wesleyan College Baseball Player Remains Unsolved

On September 24, 2003, Michael Snapp was out in Virginia Beach having a good time with friends. He arrived home in the early morning hours of the 25th and was seen by a couple of friends cooking food in his kitchen, where he lived at Downeast Court.

Less than 30 minutes later, his roommate may have heard the doorbell and shortly thereafter, he heard something hit the floor. However, it was a sound that was not alarming enough to cause concern. Then, 15 minutes later, the roommate left his room for the bathroom and found Michael Snapp in a pool of blood on the floor. He has been shot and died immediately.

Snapp, 19, was a sophomore at Virginia Wesleyan College and a talented starting third baseman for the baseball team. He started 29 games his last season and helped lead his team to reach the Old Dominion Athletic Conference and a spot in the NCAA Division III Championship Tournament. Snapp was well-liked by all at VWC and was described as a kind, laid-back individual.



Snapp was a Newport News native and a graduate of Woodside High School. He was an avid baseball fan, and also enjoyed the ocean and surfing.

The homicide case of Michael Snapp is still unsolved.
